Our economy spay and neuter fees include the following:

1. A pre-anesthetic assessment will be performed as part of the procedure. A full wellness exam is required for patients 3 years and older.
2. Gas anesthesia using isoflurane.
3. Pulse oximeter monitoring of oxygen level and heart rate.
4. 2 injections of pain medication that will last a total of 24 hours.
5. The surgery itself.
6. Pain medication/anti-inflammatories while in the hospital and to go home.

A complete physical exam will be performed on your pet prior to the surgical procedure if it has been longer than 90 days since the last exam. However, this may not identify all systemic or metabolic problems. For this reason, we highly recommend doing a pre-anesthetic blood panel for pets of any age.

These options below may not be required for your pet depending on their age, however we do recommend them for the safety and comfort of your pet. By checking the box next to the option you are asking that we perform that service. Please let us know if you have any questions.

**LASER UPGRADE \$29.50**

The CO<sub>2</sub> laser seals as it cuts. This results in very little bleeding as many of the vessels are sealed. The nerve endings are also sealed so they transmit less of the pain sensation. This results in a smoother, less painful recovery period with less tissue damage.

**MICROCHIP \$39.50**

Although this can be installed at any time, it involves a fairly large needle so if done while your pet is under anesthesia and already getting pain medication, the procedure is more comfortable. Our microchip includes lifelong registration.

**PULL BABY TEETH \$34.75-\$44.75**

Most pets should have lost all of their baby teeth by the time they are 6 months of age (depending on

breed). If these teeth do not fall out on their own by this time, we strongly recommend removing the teeth at the time of the neuter or spay. You may opt to wait to see if the teeth fall out on their own at a later date, however, if the teeth do not fall out and need to be removed in the future, there will be an additional anesthetic charge.

**ELIZABETHAN COLLAR \$7.75-\$16.75**

This is the collar that goes around your pets neck to help prevent them from licking or chewing at the incision site. Not all pets need this but it is handy to have just in case.

**SOFT COLLAR \$11.06-\$28.14**

**IV FLUIDS \$89.75**

The IV catheter provides quick access to the veins case of an emergency. The fluid helps regulate blood pressure, protects the kidneys and liver, and prevents dehydration. They also help your pet during the recovery period from anesthesia during the period after the anesthesia. This is strongly recommended for all pets and **is required for pets age 7 years and older.**

**PRE ANESTHETIC BLOOD TESTING \$180.00 - \$200.00**

We run a very thorough test of approximately 35 different things, including a CBC for anemia and white blood cell problems, testing for liver, kidney, electrolyte problems, diabetes, thyroid levels and many other things. This is an option if your pet is under 7 years old and **is required for pets 7 years and older.**

**SEDATIVES TO GO HOME \$15.75**

In order to keep your pet calmer during the 2 week recuperation period we can send home sedatives.

**\*Please Note:** If your pet is in heat, pregnant or both testicles have not descended at the time of surgery then there will be additional charges.

I understand that some risks always exist with anesthesia and/ or surgery and that I am encouraged to discuss any concerns I have about those risks with the attending veterinarian before the procedure(s) is/are initiated.
